[...] restore that person gently. But watch yourselves, or you also may be tempted. Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. [...] without comparing themselves to someone else, for each one should carry their own load. (Gal. 6:1-5 NIV)

Dear Prayer Partners,

Christoph and I attended a seminar last week with some OMF team members and part of the training addressed "responsibility". One of the Bible passages we looked at is that noted above. A key point in life as a Christian is to know what our responsibility is, and what it is not. In this text, someone has been stumbled by sin. A Christian brother or sister is responsible for: restoring that person (though GENTLY), watching themselves that they not be tempted, carrying the burdens of that other person (burdens are things that are overwhelming, not normal responsibilities), being humble, testing their own actions, and not comparing themselves with others. The only action that is the responsibility of the person caught in sin would be to repent, of course, and then to carry their own load (a manageable job). May God help us to help each other, humbly and gently, but may we do what is our responsibility – no more, no less!

One other gem from the training for me was that sometimes there are no easy answers and tough choices need to be made. In some cases, all choices are bad, so we need God's wisdom to choose the best of the worst, so to speak. Keeping everyone happy (avoiding conflict) is one of my personal weaknesses (though it can also be a strength), so this part of the training was freeing for me. As I work with a few ministries in a few different organisations, juggling my time to fulfill my *responsibilities* can create tension, especially when schedules clash. May God help me to make wise decisions, choosing the best of (in my sight) sometimes unsatisfactory choices.

Lydia: The last six weeks have been most interesting concerning Lydia's further education and the apprenticeship program. Lydia has worked on a project at school related to becoming a hairdresser, has attended a career fair and will soon have a meeting with her assigned career counselor. We are so thankful for the Swiss system which allows for lots of variations. The best advice I have heard yet was: "Just help your teen find a good apprenticeship for three or four years. She can always change her track and do something totally different afterwards. Help her understand that her apprenticeship doesn't mean she will be 'stuck' in that career until retirement."

AIDS Care and Saisampan: One thing that these two ministries have in common is that December is big outreach time. All leaders try to maximize the impact of Christmas by holding events to invite Christians, seekers and people who have never heard the gospel. Pray that all outreaches will present the gospel in a culturally sensitive way, for open hearts and for appropriate follow-up.
